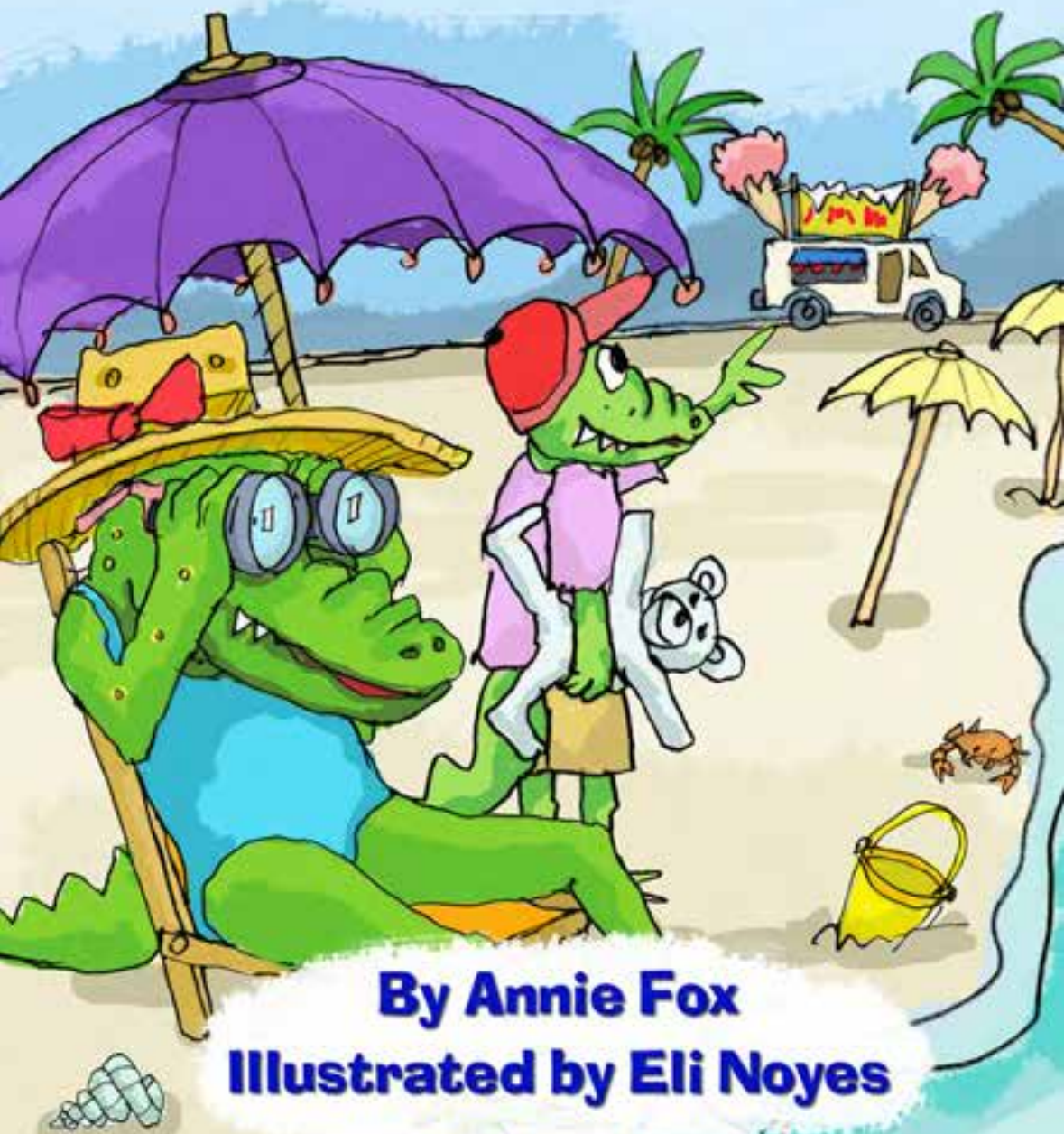

"No way!" said Sheila. "I can't leave you unattended."

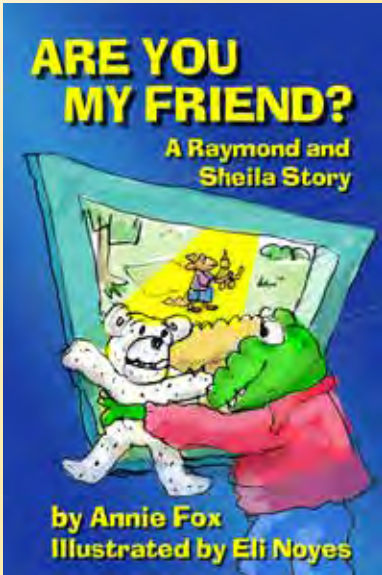


Raymond didn't know what that meant but it didn't sound too hard. "I can leave *you* unattended," he said. "And I'll get the ice cream."
