### **Q&A WITH AUTHOR ANNIE FOX**

#### Q: Where did you get the inspiration for Leeta Simtar?

A: I've always been interested in the challenges of being a stranger in a strange land. With Leeta, I decided to add a whole other level to her strangeness by making her a one-of-a-kind interspecies hybrid who's a stranger on her home planet. You've gotta feel for this girl and root for her! I love creating characters who are outsiders so I can see how they handle the challenges of being who they are in spite of everyone else telling them who they ought to be.



# Q: Do you see yourself in Leeta Simtar or any of the other characters?

A: When a movie is made of this novel, I'd like to play the part of Angela. She and I are similar in that we're both nurturing types who love our dogs and look out for kids.

#### Q: Sid isn't your typical romantic lead. How did you dream him up?

A: Typical romantic leads are boring. I love Sid because he's not typical or boring. He's fun and playful and he's got a really good heart. Sid's sensitive and super creative. He sees Leeta and pretty much falls for her instantly. She's a foot taller than he is, but who cares? He's heard she needs a friend, and he wants to prove himself to be the kind of person she can count on 100%. Who wouldn't want a friend like that? In some ways, Sid reminds me of my husband David. He's about a foot taller than me and yeah, he's my best friend.

#### Q: What are your favorite sci-fi books?

A: I've read and enjoyed sci-fi classics like Earth Abides by George R. Stewart. When Worlds Collide by Phillip Wylie and Edwin Balmer, Stranger in a Strange Land by Robert Heinlein. Also more recent books like The Martian and Project Hail Mary, both by Andy Weir. I don't read a lot of sci-fi, but I've always been fascinated by the idea of life on other planets. At one point as a kid, I wanted to grow up to be an astronomer.



To do that she'd have to leave one world and explore another. That's when the subtitle came to me, A Life on Two Planets.



A: Yes, I am. It's a YA romantasy called Paige Turner and the Happily Ever After Wars. It will be published sometime in 2027. Or maybe sooner.





#### Q: What do you like to do when you're not writing?

A: These days I've been painting—mostly abstract stuff, though I did paint a portrait of Leeta Simtar that I rather like. When I'm not writing or painting, I love to hike through forests or any totally immersive natural environment with David and Gracie the Dog. I love taking photos while hiking, though the images I capture are never as good as being there. I also love to travel internationally.
